LOOKING FOR WAYS TO LOWER YOUR TAXABLE INCOME?



If you are age 70-1/2 or older IRS rules require you to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your tax deferred retirement account.

To reduce the impact of RMD income investors may want to consider making a "Qualified Charitable Distribution" (QCD).

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. (OLM qualifies). Contributions can be excluded from your taxable income, thus reducing your tax bill.

You could consider Our Lady of Mercy ...

There are several possibilities to consider with regard to your contributions:

- 1. You could transfer a lump sum from your IRA to satisfy your CSA pledge.
- 2. You could transfer a lump sum (or several lump sums during the year) from your IRA account to satisfy your weekly offertory amount. Those using Faith Direct can adjust their contributions accordingly.
- 3. You could transfer one or several lump sums to satisfy both of the above.

All that you need to do is contact your custodian and tell them what you would like to do. They will send a form to complete. It's very easy.

"Once you take the step, you will never be alone in your journey"



A few weeks ago, on April 20 at our Easter Vigil, Steve Brainard entered into full communion in the Catholic

Church as he celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation and received the Eucharist for the first time. This joyous celebration was the culmination of nearly a year and a half of study, prayer and community. It was also the commencement of a life of ever deepening commitment to following Christ moment by moment.

Steve Brainard and his wife and sponsor Maureen are familiar to those who attend the 11:00 Sunday Mass. Last April, Steve was welcomed into the Catechumenate, a period of intense study and prayer that usually spans a year. Week after week, this community has held Steve in prayer as he has joined them for the Liturgy of the Word before leaving to reflect more deeply on those readings. Steve and Maureen are also familiar to the rest of the parish family. From social events like the parish Mardi Gras to serving the community as a lector, from opportunities for spiritual growth such as the parish mission to a generous and humble presence in the wider Harborcreek area, Steve, and his sponsor, have been eager to grow in and respond to the call of the Gospel.

Many people resist the annulment process, but it was this very process that Steve credits for sparking his interest in the Catholic Church: "I first became interested in the Catholic faith during the annulment process in preparation for marriage. I gained a respect for the Church. I also increased my interest during and after our marriage ceremony." Needless to say, journeys like this usually can cite multiple sources and this is true of Steve. "Of course Fr. Ritchie was and is a key part of my desire to become Catholic and join the Church."

Although Steve was recently welcomed into the

Catholic Church, his Christian life goes back decades. His parents planted the seed, raising him in the Protestant faith and nurturing that seed through Sunday school. The witness of friends, many who are members of OLM and his Cursillo weekend watered that seed over the years. And, in the past 18 months, that growing seed has taken on the specific colors and fragrance of the Catholic faith.

The Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA) can feel like a huge commitment when first presented to a person inquiring. But, as the year unfolds, what initially felt overwhelming becomes a gift to be treasured. "At first it seemed like a long process but as we began the process we looked forward to the sessions and learning about the bible. We couldn't believe the time commitment of the RCIA team and all they had to share. We cannot think of a time we complained about coming. The process helped us to gain insight about ourselves separately and together regarding our relationship with God."

Those in the RCIA process are an inspiration to the parishioners around them. Far too often our familiarity with the Mass, the gift of the Eucharist, the beauty of the Catholic faith can lead us to take them for granted. The longing, the hunger of those preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation challenge us to remember, to reflect on the value of what we have been given. In the weeks leading up to Easter, Steve was asked what he was looking forward to. His answer was "I mostly am anxious to receive the Eucharist now that I know its true meaning. I look forward to coming into full communion with God and my OLM family!" The Eucharist and our membership in the Catholic Church should be something we celebrate with just as much joy each and every Sunday.

The role of the sponsor is a vital part of the RCIA process. The sponsor walks alongside the candidate, sharing the journey, witnessing to faith on a personal level, encouraging and reflecting back to the candidate the growth that is unfolding. As sponsor, Maureen has had a special vantage point from which to watch the transformation in Steve. "First I need to say I never thought the day would come that Steve would consider being a Catholic. In fact, when he agreed to marry in the Church I recall him saying this doesn't mean I'll become a Catholic. It has been a transformation for him. He has always had a kind heart but this process has made him even more in tune to the needs of others. It has been heartwarming to witness his curiosity and questioning."

Steve was asked what he might say to those who have thought about the Catholic faith but not taken the step to begin any formal process. "Why not seek it and at least try. If you don't take that step you will be short changing yourself. Once you take the step, you will never be alone in your journey."

If you are interested in exploring the Catholic faith

or the possibility of being baptized into the life of Christ, there is no better time than the present. Because the RCIA is a year long process, those desiring to be baptized or welcomed into full communion in the Catholic Church at the next Easter need to begin the process now. If making an official contact seems too intimidating, start with a conversation with any member of this faith community. As Steve and Maureen say "We have never felt alone in this journey. We have felt supported by the OLM community including those we have known and the many new friends we have made along the way. Everyone is welcoming and we truly feel part of the OLM family. It makes us want to give back which has been given so freely to us.

Asking the **BIG** Questions

OLM hosts Mercyhurst University students to moderate thoughtful discussion

When was the last time you asked yourself the big questions about the Church?

This spring, a group of 10 Our Lady of Mercy parishioners had the opportunity to dig deeper in a group discussion led by freshmen from Mercyhurst University. As part of an elective theology class, the group of students developed a list of 29 challenging questions, such as:

- From your perspective, is the role of the laity considered to be important in the mission of the Church today? Why or why not?
- What do you think needs to be done to counteract the decline of priests and religious in the U.S. Church? Or is this decline happening for a reason?
- How has the clergy sex abuse crisis affected your understanding of and commitment to the Church?
- What are your concerns about the local church today and for the future?
- If you had the power to do anything to change and enhance the Church's identity in the future, what would your vision of Church look like?

Different groups from the Mercyhurst theology class traveled to various churches in the Erie area to moderate similar discussions. The students will present their findings in class this semester.

A wide range of perspectives and experiences was represented in the room, from lifelong OLM members to RCIA graduates to new parishioners. It was a robust, respectful, and thought-provoking discussion!
