

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line.

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments



The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children's CyberTipline is the nation's centralized reporting system for the online exploitation of children. Anyone can make reports of suspected online enticement of children for sexual acts, molestation, child pornography, child sex tourism, child sex trafficking (includes prostitution), child sextortion and unsolicited obscene materials sent to a child. Misleading domain names, misleading words or digital images on the internet can also be reported to the CyberTipline. All tips are reviewed to find a potential location for the reported incident. It is then made available to the appropriate law-enforcement agency for possible investigation. NCMEC provides resources/ help in removing an online image. Reports can be made 24/7 online at www.cybertipline.org or by calling (800) 843-5678.

What is spiritual direction? Come and see on Monday, April 29, 6:30-8:00pm

Spiritual direction is a conversation between two people. It is an ancient tradition of holy listening that involves the Holy Spirit, the spiritual director (someone trained in holy listening), and the directee (the spiritual seeker). Each has a distinct role in helping us become more aware of God's presence and action in daily life.

As a person shares what's been happening in their prayer and daily life with the spiritual director/companion, the director/companion carefully listens for the Holy Spirit's nudges and promptings. This deep listening for God at work in the directee/seeker's life helps the director ask questions and offer observations that can help the seeker clarify their experience of God. This increased clarity can help a person discover what God is inviting them to and to gain awareness of what gets in the way of their growth in God. Spiritual directors are not "the expert," but are spiritual companions educated to listen for the holy in the ordinary.

People meet with a spiritual director for many reasons. Perhaps they want to grow in relationship with God and are seeking suggestions to start or deepen their prayer lives. Perhaps they are trying to sort through whether an opportunity is an invitation from God or something else. People may be drawn to spiritual direction when they are in the middle of a major transition or crisis of faith.

No matter where you are on your faith journey, we invite you to learn more about spiritual direction so you can consider whether you might like to meet with a spiritual director who can accompany you deeper in your encounter with Christ.
