# A Year of Jubilee Pilgrims of Hope

Pope Francis has declared 2025 A Year of Jubilee. Jubilee years are also known as Holy Years because these years of grace call the faithful to renewed relationship with God, with one another and with creation.

The Jubilee has its roots in the Bible. Leviticus 25 calls God's people to set aside every seventh year as a sabbatical year, a year dedicated to God. When the community had celebrated seven sabbaticals, the next year was declared a Jubilee. Every 50 years, the Jubilee demanded that property be returned to its ancestral owner, debts be forgiven, slaves be set free, the land be allowed to rest and be renewed as it lay fallow, grievances be reconciled and justice and harmony be restored to the community.

Jesus begins his public ministry with the words of the prophet Isaiah,

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" (Lk. 4:18-19)

With these words, Jesus connects his work with God's ancient vision for the Jubilee. Through His teachings, healings and forgiveness, Jesus brings about the renewal of relationship with God, others and creation which is at the heart of the Holy Year.

The first Jubilee Year in the Catholic Church was called by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300. His vision was to have a Jubilee every century. In 1470, Pope Paul II established the Jubilee every 25 years. These regular calling of a "Jubilee" are "ordinary Jubilees". Periodically the Pope will call for an additional or "extraordinary Jubilee". The most recent "extraordinary Jubilee" was the Year of Mercy in 2015.

It has become tradition to begin the Jubilee Year in December with the opening of the "Holy Door" at St. Peter Basilica and to bring it to a close on Epiphany a year later. The open Holy Door symbolizes the invitation to enter into God's transforming grace by which we are made "holy". These months are a time of

pilgrimage as the people renew their commitment to journey together into the Kingdom of God.

"Pilgrims of Hope" is the theme for this Holy Year. As the world grapples with the devastation of wars, the lingering effects of COVID, the impact of climate change, we are reminded of the hope we have from Christ, the hope that informs our vision of the future and our response to the present.

In preparation for this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis has asked the Church to dedicate 2024 as a year of prayer. He has also challenged Catholics to take time over the coming months to study the key documents of the Second Vatican Council.

2025 is a special year for our parish family. As the Church celebrates this Jubilee Year, Our Lady of Mercy celebrates the 25th anniversary of the new building. It is an opportunity to remember with gratitude where we have been, to anticipate with hope where God is leading us and to celebrate with joy the grace that is ours in the present. Our parish anniversary will be launched with our September 29 feast day celebration. Our Mass on Christmas Eve will connect our community to the opening of the Holy Door in Rome. April 9, the anniversary of the dedication of our Worship Space, will be a highlight of the year with a special Mass celebrated by Bishop Persico followed by a parish party. Mark your calendar. Between September 29 and April 9, we will have opportunities to share memories, reconnect to the beauty of our Worship Space and deepen our commitment to Christ and each other. Watch the announcements as each piece unfolds.

May this Holy Year draw each of us to the transforming grace of God. In our anniversary celebration, may we be renewed in the faith we profess, the hope we proclaim, the love we enflesh. May this be a Holy Year for a holy people in Harborcreek.


Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World (Gaudium et Spes):

## LEADER FOR BAPTISMAL PREP NEEDED





Hints of fall are everywhere. Back to school sales are being advertised. Nights hold the nip of autumn. Days are growing shorter. As families prepare for a new school year, the OLM family is preparing for a new year of religious education. With the changes to our Mass schedule, there will be changes to our **faith formation schedule also**.

Registration for the 2024~2025 religious education program will take place after Masses the weekend of August 17~18. If you have found that you have missed the general registration weekend, please stop by the Office of Lifelong Faith Formation during normal working hours. All



families with children intending to participate in the 2024~2025 Rel. Ed. program are asked to register at this time. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Again this year, there will be a \$10 discount on the registration fee for those families who provide the parish with current clearances for at least one parent. If you already submitted clearances and they are less than 3 years old, the discount will apply. As most of you know, all those who volunteer with children must have government issued clearances, both Criminal Background checks and Child Abuse Clearances. This law applies to parents helping with a classroom party, chaperoning a field trip, religious education substitutes and the like. These clearances are free for volunteers. However, they must be on file with the sponsoring organization before any volunteer can assist with any aspect of any program.

Our Lady of Mercy believes that parent participation in the religious education ministry is essential to its success. Whether parents can volunteer on a weekly basis or assist with a one-time project, we value your gifts and time. The only way that we can involve parents is if we have their clearances on file.

Many of you already have obtained these clearances for school, scouting, sports or other programs. If you do not already have these documents, you can apply on-line. All links can be found at the diocesan website http://eriercd.org. If you have any difficulty completing the on-line application for these clearances, call the parish and we will assist you.

Program Fees may be paid at the time of registration. Checks should be made payable to Our Lady of Mercy Religious Education. Program fees are:

For a family who has current Criminal Background Checks and Child Abuse Clearances on at least one parent on file at OLM, the fee schedule is:

\$45.00	Registration-Per Child Non-Parishioner
\$10.00	Youth Ministry fee per child Gr 7~12

If we have current clearances on file, a notation will appear on your registration form. If you present clearances at time of registration, the registration fee will be adjusted accordingly.

<u>Kindergarten</u> religious education class is held on Sunday mornings from 10:30~12:00. Participants must be age 5 by September 1 and should be in the same school grade. The Kindergarten group meets in classroom #5

Grade One religious education is required prior to participation in the Sacramental Preparation program. First grade religious education students meet in classroom #7 on Sunday mornings from 10:30-12:00.

First Reconciliation preparation is conducted on the second grade level. The First Reconciliation program, held 10:30-12:00 Sunday morning in classroom #6, is open to all students in Grade 2 or older who have previously been involved in at least one year of religious instruction and who have been baptized. No child can be registered for the grade 2 RE class who has not attended one year of formal religious education classes at a Catholic parish. In order to qualify as successfully completing 1 year of instruction, the child must have been present for a minimum of 3/4th of the schedule classes or provide a letter of completion from the pastor or director of the parish program they attended stating such. Participation in a 3-hour preparatory retreat is required prior to the celebration of the sacrament. The celebration of First Reconciliation occurs in March. Parental support and involvement is essential during periods of sacramental preparation.

**First Eucharist** preparation is the curriculum for the third grade program. Individuals must have celebrated the sacraments of Baptism and Reconciliation prior to the celebration of their First Eucharist. First Eucharist is celebrated in May. Students are required to participate in an April retreat day as part of the preparation program. Parental involvement and support is essential during periods of sacramental preparation.

The Intermediate Program encompasses grades 3-6. Students participating in religious education on this level gather for classes on Tuesday afternoons from 4:00-5:30. The school bus service for Harbor Creek School District brings children from the Harbor Creek elementary schools to the parish. Parents are responsible for picking up their children at class end.

Behavior for the Rel. Ed. bus follows the same policies as that enforced by the Harbor Creek School District. Failure by any student to behave in an appropriate fashion while riding the bus to religious education classes will result in the suspension of the privilege to receive this transportation for the remainder of the academic year.

**Junior High youth** meet Sunday from 10:30-12:00. Combining fun activities, faith sharing, witness talks and prayer, 7th & 8th grade youth are invited into a deeper relationship with Christ and with His Body, the Church. The junior high group gathers in the gym. Diocesan policy mandates that youth participate in 7th & 8th grade faith formation prior to beginning Confirmation preparation. The Diocese of Erie requires 90% attendance at this level.

Confirmation Preparation takes place in 9th grade. Those attending a Catholic high school must prepare for the sacrament in their home parish. This program includes small group Sessions, service projects, retreat days, etc. Those celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation must be in the second semester of 9th grade or older, have been baptized, and have completed all requirements. Confirmation preparation takes place Sunday from 10:30-12:00. The group meets in the Ritchie Room.

Days of Retreat are provided for students in the formal religious education program. All program provided retreat experiences are free to participants. Attendance at these events is required for those preparing for a sacramental celebration (Grade 2 First Reconciliation, Grade 3 First Eucharist and Grade 9 Confirmation). All other experiences are encouraged, but not mandatory. These days combine fun with spiritual growth.

**Family Faith Days** are opportunities for families to share in the faith formation process with their children. Currently, these are scheduled twice during the school year during the Sunday morning program. On these specially designated mornings, all children in **Kindergarten through gr. 2** are joined by parents, siblings and any extended family members to share in a special morning of prayer and fun.

Parent Meetings enable family members to best support the faith development of their child. Every year we hold a series of parent meetings designed to inform parents of curriculum topics, special projects and other details of interest. All parent meetings are designed to be informative and brief. All parents and guardians are highly encouraged to attend these meetings. Please consult the religious education calendar and the bulletin for specific times and dates.

Absentee Policy: Preparing for a sacramental celebration is a very important process. Extra care and attention is directed to these parts of the program by the R. E. Office, the catechists and the families. To ensure that youth are as well prepared as possible, attendance policies are in place for these years. Children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist (grades 1, 2 & 3) must be present for a minimum of ¾ of scheduled classes. Any child absent for more than a quarter of the scheduled classes will not be approved to celebrate this sacrament. (Any first grade student who has missed more than a quarter of the scheduled classes will not have met the requirement of completing a year of religious ed necessary to enter the First Reconciliation program.) Jr. High youth are required to attend 90% of the 7th & 8th grade sessions before enrolling in Confirmation preparation. Confirmation candidates (grade 9) are mandated by diocesan policy to attend 90% of the sessions. Additional absences must be made up with the Director of Lifelong Faith Formation before the candidate can continue in the process. Additionally, this year of preparation includes work to be done at home. All homework must be completed and returned before the individual will be approved for the sacramental celebration.

To all returning catechetical ministers, students and families, I look forward to seeing you soon. To all new participants in the religious education program, I welcome you. To all members of this parish community, I encourage your comments, ideas and suggestions.

Religious Education Classes begin on Tuesday, September 3. Religious Education calendars are available at the time of registration.

May you continue to deepen your love for God and one another. May the remaining weeks of the summer season bring many blessings.

In these times of confusion, divisions, and even uncertainty and fear, the winds are blowing for fresh air, for inspiration, for courage and even joy. What better time to treat ourselves to a series of uplifting sessions offered in our parish community by Irishborn storyteller, biblical scholar, and poet Tricia Hoyt?

In Tricia's words, "Taking on the courage of the Gospels and the deep well of spiritual wholeness offered to us through God's wisdom in the ancient sacred texts is <u>mighty</u> work... some might say intimidating and almost too complex! But no, I say it's the perfect opportunity for creativity, poetry, humor, and story to enlighten us with respect to the spiritual depth we need in our families and communities today."

Bringing a heart wide and light to stories old and ever-new, Tricia Hoyt offers three evenings that will enthrall, challenge, and inspire us.

Tricia Hoyt is a biblical scholar, retreat director, leadership trainer, educator, and writer. Originally from Ireland, she resided in France and Peru before moving to the U.S. in 1981. She worked for 30 years as an educator and leadership trainer in Arizona, serving as director of the Diocesan Office of Peace and Justice; director of the School of Biblical Studies at Kino Institute of Theological Studies; and director of the Leadership Wellness Center at the Franciscan Renewal Center. She has traveled frequently across the U.S. and in Europe to offer workshops on biblical storytelling and a spirituality for justice. Tricia holds a MA in Adult Christian Community Development from Regis University in Denver, and completed ten years of doctoral work in Biblical Interpretation at Brite Divinity School (TCU), Fort Worth. She has four adult children and 9 extraordinary grandchildren.
